BOARD MINUTES August 13, 2020

Summarized **MINUTES** from a regular Board of Commissioners meeting of Scott Valley Fire Protection District, Greenview, California. The meeting was held on Thursday August 13, 2020 and was opened at 6:00 p.m. by Chair Larry Alexander. Present were Vice Chair James C. Roseman, and board members Jay Akerman, Kathleen Williams, and Kevin Hullquist. Acting Chief Scott Frick and Administrative Officer Nancy Salucci were also present.

PUBLIC COMMENTS Finding a new home for Scott River Station emergency response vehicles: Retired Chief Austin and Acting Chief Frick explained that they disposed of several loads of surplus equipment from the Scott River station. There is only one more load to remove, plus our heater, propane tank and signage. 2400 feet of surplus hose was donated to Gazelle, Montague, and Mayten fire departments. Campora will remove their propane tank and give us credit for the remaining fuel. Tanker 1537 is currently at Captain Pearson's house.

We need a place to house two engines. There is no time left this year to reconstruct the metal building stored at Chief Buchter's. Options now are:

- 1. Build a frame building on the existing slab behind the current Greenview Station. Austin has measured the slab and two engines will fit. The slab was built to code many years ago and was permitted as a body shop. Austin offered to mill and donate the dimensional lumber for the framing (\$15,000 value). Siding, trusses, roofing, and electrical will need to be purchased. To meet code, the building would need a 4' set-back from the property line and a two-hour firewall which would require two layers of sheetrock on the outside and two layers on the inside of the framing. Estimated construction cost is \$15,000-\$18,000. Austin says we have enough qualified volunteers to erect the building. \$30,000 has been budgeted this year for construction on the Greenview site.
- 2. Entering into a Memorandum of Understanding with Quartz Valley Indian Reservation is another possibility. We may be able to house one piece of equipment at their station. We could have their firefighters join SVFPD so they could use our equipment and take advantage of our training program. Frick and Austin met with Veronica Rasmussen, Fire Administrator who will approach the QVIR board for their input and approval and possibly drafting a MOU.
- 3. Captain Pearson has generously offered the use of his shop on Scott River Road. The building needs reroofing and insulating and the project would require relocating a significant amount of tools and equipment from the shop during construction. SVFPD would be putting money into a building that is not owned by the department.
- 4. Commissioner Hullquist and Dr. Cunha on Scott River Road have expressed their willingness to work with SVFPD to locate a station on their respective properties. Again, these options would require putting money into a building that is not owned by the department.
- 5. The vehicles (1517 and 1537) could be drained and tarped and stored for the winter in the lot adjacent to the Greenview Station.

Acting Chief Scott Frick

New firefighter applications, deletions from roster There are currently seven applications pending. Training/Safety/Injury and Illness Prevention Program monthly report Drafting and pump transfer, safely chalking vehicles, and LCES: Lookouts, Communications, Escape Routes, Safety Zones were discussed. Update on status of "chaser rig" for strike team participation We have the pink slip for the 2011 Ford pickup. The vehicle will now be registered, Administrator Salucci will insure it, and Frick will proceed to have the engine replaced.

<u>Highlights of monthly incidents</u> SVFPD was dispatched to fifty-three fires and medical incidents in July—the highest count in SVFPD's history.

Continuing/New business

- Siskiyou County may apply for a \$1,000,000 FEMA grant for radios on behalf of the Chiefs Association.
 Each department needs to be digitally compliant by 2021. Pagers will cost \$1640 each and dash mounted radios \$2500 each.
- Alvin Lewis, one of the founders of the Greenview Fire Department, contacted Acting Chief Frick and gave Frick the original deed to the Greenview Station.
- Copies of the 2020 CalFire Agreement has been placed in each of our vehicles. Invoicing is now done
 electronically by Acting Chief Frick within five days of an incident.
- All new recruits must get a complete physical that includes the spirometer test. DMV license medical exams do not qualify.

Approval of policy revisions 2020.11 and 2020.12 Uniforms & Protective Clothing

POLICY TITLE: Uniforms and Protective Clothing

POLICY NUMBER: 2020 (revised 1/8/96, 6/13/02, 8/8/13, 2/1/2020, 8/13/2020)

2020.10 Chiefs shall wear a uniform and badge when engaged in department business representing the department. The district will provide white uniform shirts. An appropriate badge will be provided. All issued equipment shall remain property of the Department.

2020.11 Firefighters shall wear a uniform and badge when engaged in department business.

2020.12 Firefighters will be issued a department approved uniform, nametag and badge. All issued components shall remain the property of the department. It is the responsibility of the member to return all issued gear at the time of separation from the District. Any items not returned will be charged to the departing member at replacement cost.
